As a professional artist for over 20 years exhibiting both nationally and internationally, Ashley welcomes the opportunity to share his experience and passion for painting through his workshops.

Working in partnership with schools his workshops can cross boundaries and connect

to geography, history and the local environment.

He has worked with students of all ages from Primary to Degree level and has recently played a key role in the 'Nick Darke' themed Art Tent at St Petroc's Primary School, working with students in the Foundation stage.

In addition his experience includes running after school clubs, giving lectures and working as 'Artist in Residence' teaching oil painting and assisting 'A' level students prepare for an exhibition.

His workshops can include painting, drawing and collage either on a small scale or as part of a larger collaborative piece for permanent display.

Ashley offers a flexible approach to his workshops and is happy to discuss any ideas you may have.

The Artist Ashley Hanson

After initially studying architecture, Ashley graduated from Canterbury College of Art in 1983 with a First Class Honours degree. Ashley spent the next 20 years in London developing his art and exhibiting widely. In 1991 he was a prize winner in the prestigious Hunting Art Prizes and in 1997 was awarded a Boise Travel Scholarship from the Slade school of Art that allowed him to pursue his interest in the USA which inspired his 'Americascapes' series of works.

In 2005 he moved to Cornwall to concentrate on his career and be closer to the coastal landscape that inspires his work.



Ashley is particularly drawn to the unique shapes and images of coastal towns with their mix of the natural and man-made. Using complimentary colours his paintings are both vibrant and refined. 'There is a magic moment in each painting when the paint gains an identity and I have a language I can believe in. My philosophy is to mistrust what you know and find something new in each painting.'



He has exhibited in numerous galleries within Cornwall Devon and beyond, including the Belgrave, St Ives, The Square Gallery, St Mawes, Padstow Fine Art Gallery, Somerville, Plymouth and the Brownston Gallery, Modbury, Devon.

Ashley has also been a featured artist in both Inside Cornwall and Cornwall Today Publications.
